Introduction

The Lock Out Tag Out (LOTO) system is a critical safety protocol designed to protect personnel from hazardous energy during maintenance and servicing of machines and equipment. Failure to properly control energy sources can result in severe injuries or fatalities. A structured LOTO program helps organizations ensure full compliance with international safety standards and regulations.
